ITINERARIO

DAY 1: UYUNI - COLCHANI - INCAHUASI ISLAND - PIA PIA ISLAND - AJEN-

CHA

Your tour will begin at 10:30 am, at Perla de Bolivia's office. The first stop will be Uyuni's 'train graveyard', to see the

first locomotives in Bolivia. You'll then visit the small settlement of Colchani (salt miners' workshops next to the salt flats). Here, you'll see handicrafts made of salt, and textile art made of llama and alpaca fiber. The tour will continue onto the great Salt Flats of Uyuni, which are at an altitude of 3650m. Take photos as you cruise along the vast white expanse of salt, see Los Ojos de Agua Salada ('salt water eyes') and then visit a hotel made completely of salt! This amazing place currently serves as a museum. Following this jam-packed morning, after lunch you'll carry on to "Isla Incahuasi" (Fish Island), where you will have time to take a hike to the top of the island to see giant cacti, and rock formations made of petrified coral.

Make sure you and your group pose for some fun perspective- and proportion-distorted photos, taken against the backdrop of the striking white surface of the salt flats. Lunch will be served on "Isla Incahuasi" (fish island) where you will have time to take a hike to the top of the island to see giant cactus and rock formations made of petrified coral. perspective and proportion-distpred potos on the blinding White Surface of the salt flats. Then head to Pia Pia island for the unique esperience of seeing a beautiful sunset over the salt flats. Have dinner and spend the night at Ajencha town at night enjoy star gazing from an amazing look out point through a telescope before going to bed (not possible on foggy nights). Accommodation: Salt hostel "Santiago Jukil" in Ajencha - double rooms.

DAY 2: CHIGUANA DESERT - CAVES - LAGOONS - EDUARDO AVAROA NA-

TIONAL RESERVE - RED LAGOON Start the morning off at 7:00 am with breakfast, before going to visit the Chiguana Desert, located on the south side of the Uyuni salt flats. It is surrounded by volcanoes, such as the Ollague Volcano (5840m), one that is still

active, and that can be seen from the lookout. Next, we'll stop to visit the Cueva del Diablo (Devil's Cave), and the Cueva Galaxia (Galaxy Cave), where you can see mummies, stalagmites and stalactites. After the caves, we'll continue along a rocky road - Pasito Tuntun - to

the beautiful Andean lagoons, inhabited by 3 species of Andean flamingos. Marvel at three lagoons on the way: 'Cañapa' where you'll spot the first pink flamingos, 'Hedionda' where lunch will be served, and 'Chiarcota' where you'll see a wider variety of birds and altiplanic fauna. We'll then enter the Eduardo Avaroa National Reserve, and visit the Desert of Siloli, at 4550m (the highest and driest desert in the world). Make sure you take a photo next to the 'Rock tree', a lava rock formation. Before arriving to your final destination of the day, we will stop at the view point by the Red Lagoon, where you can spot more pink

flamingos in their natural habitat, and admire this intense, red-coloured lake. Stay the night at a shared family

DAY 3: SOL DE MAÑANA GEYSER - DALI DESERT - GREEN LAGOON - UYUNI

Accommodation: Shared family lodging, "Los Lipes" (dorm of 6 beds)

Lagoon - toxic copper water at the foot of the big Licancabur volcano, which sits at 6000m, a few kilometres from the Bolivia-Chile border. Finally, you'll head back to Uyuni, passing beautiful scenery along the way, and eating a picnic lunch next to the roadside. You'll go by the Valley of the Rocks, the Alota settlement, and the San Cristobal Village, where you'll visit the church, and see the exquisite colonial paintings. We'll get back to Uyuni by 6:30 pm. For those that wish to finish at San Pedro de Atacama in Chile instead of coming back to Uyuni: Guides will assist

SUGGESTED PACKING LIST:

most hotels), hand sanitizer, personal first aid kit. you will be sleeping up to 4300 meters above sea level and depending on the season, temperaturas can drop well below zero (reaching less tan - 15 degrees celsius in the winter months of june and july) and the wind chill can be harsh, so bring plenty warm clothes like a scarf and wool

ACCOMMODATION/FACILITIES ON TOUR: The accommodation on the Uyuni Salt Flats tour will be bare-bones basic with basic cots in shared romos. On occasion there may not be electricity or runnung water due to lack of infrastructureand services in the national park. You will be travelling in the middle of the desert – toilet facilities will only be available on the first day of Uyuni tour and might have a small local cost. Note: as you will come back to your departure point, please ONLY BRING the necessary material and clothes during the tour. REMEMBER: it can get very cold especially during the Winter months of june and july so bring extra

extra warm clothes along like a scarf and wool hat to keep warm. We also recommend bringing an extra 5 liters
